► IN-PERSON

The in-person conference will be located at the Rocky Mountain Synod's Messiah Mountain Retreat Center, only 30 minutes from Downtown Denver, CO

- Participants are welcome to bring a pillow & sleeping bag to bunk-up in the MMRC cabin; set up a tent or camper (no power or water hook-ups available); or book a room at one of the nearby hotels
