## **Domestic Hunger Ministry Highlight**

The **El Centro de Los Pobres** (located in the town of Avondale, Colorado) is one of the domestic hunger grant recipients on the territory of the Rocky Mountain Synod. The center is a non-profit operating on a very small budget and run by volunteers, including its director Sister Nancy Crafton.



The Center of the People serves rural Pueblo County and the five surrounding counties. Many of the people assisted are migrant workers and immigrants seeking a better life for themselves and their families.

Los Pobres provides 200 families a week with food, clothing, some household items, and (most of all) dignity and respect. The center also offers a small medical clinic that is open one afternoon a week.

Sister Nancy purchases 600 pounds of beans and rice a week with funds provided by an ELCA World Hunger Domestic Hunger Grant. These foods are the main sustenance for many families.



Recent spikes in rates for electricity

have caused families to be unable to pay the higher bills. One family with four children lost all food in their refrigerator and is keeping eggs and milk on ice in the bathtub and cooking beans and rice on the charcoal grill. The food they receive from the center helps them survive because of YOUR support for ELCA World Hunger!

From February through August, congregations and individuals in the Rocky Mountain Synod gave \$273,178 to ELCA World Hunger.

We still rank seventh among the 65 ELCA synods!



# Congratulations to Trinity in Loveland, Colorado!



The congregation of Trinity Lutheran Church in Loveland, Colorado, celebrated over half a million dollars in gifts to ELCA World Hunger since 1974 on Sunday, September 25. Rev. Robin Brown, Associate Director for ELCA World Hunger and Disaster Appeal, was the guest preacher—bringing thanks for Trinity's consistent ranking among the top 25 Most Generous Congregations of the 9,000 congregations in the ELCA. The celebration also included a congregational dinner and sale of fair trade coffee and gift items.

How does Trinity accomplish such generosity? Pastor Barb Linder, who wrote a history of Trinity, notes that commitment to social ministry outreach has been part of the congregation's DNA since its founding in 1905: "The thread goes way back."

Kathy Hume, chair of the Social Ministry Committee, and Marian Erdahl, World Hunger coordinator for 15 years, concur. "If you have a personal commitment to this cause," Hume says, "you're not alone here. We've always had strong pastoral commitment as well."

Erdahl explains that a bulletin insert story of ELCA World Hunger work is used every month, so the need is constantly reinforced. "Everyone knows that the first Sunday is devoted to a World Hunger offering! We all work together and are fulfilled that we help many we will never see."
