#### ▶ IN-PERSON

The in-person conference will be located at the Rocky Mountain Synod's *Messiah Mountain Retreat Center*, only 30 minutes from Downtown Denver, CO

- Participants are welcome to bring a pillow and sleeping bag to bunk-up in the MMRC cabin; set up a tent or camper (no power or water hook-ups available); or book a room at one of the nearby hotels.
- Snacks and the following meals will be provided:
  - Monday dinner provided (Lunch on your own)
  - Tuesday breakfast, lunch, and dinner provided
  - Wednesday breakfast provided (Lunch on your own)
- Dietary restrictions can be accommodated upon request.

#### ▶ ONLINE

The online conference will be on Zoom where participants will get to sleep in their own beds and provide their own snacks and meals.

### CONFERENCE REGISTRATION:

- ▶ In-Person = \$125 per person
  - Includes conference registration, meals, snacks and any printed materials



- Space is limited to a maximum of 30 in-person people...
  - Up to 10 people sleeping in a tent/camper/home/hotel
  - Up to 20 people sleeping in the cabin
  
- ▶ Online = \$25 per login code/per device
  - Participants are welcome to participate with a congregational group or as an individual for one registration fee per device, regardless of how many people watch each device.

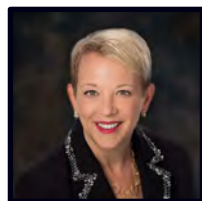
