

Ralph Patrick, Executive Director, Family Promise of Colorado Springs



Ralph comes to Family Promise with a broad background in social services and pastoral ministry. He has worked in the inner city of Chicago, and Del Rio, TX., and served as a senior pastor in Las Cruces, New Mexico, and Ft. Collins, CO. He also spent three years as an evangelistic missionary in the Enga Province of Papua New Guinea. Most recently Ralph worked as a Regional Director and Director of Community Engagement in the Colorado chapter of The Alzheimer's Association. He has a B.A., Concordia University, St. Paul; M.Div., Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne; M. Theol. Glasgow University. Ralph has been trained as both a spiritual director and life coach. He has made numerous humanitarian trips to Sierra Leone, Africa; Haiti, and most recently Battambang, Cambodia. Ralph is passionate about making an impact with those who are

Vicki Profitt: Sarah's Home & Daniel Academy



Born into Christian a home. my parents were then pastors church plantteachers ers. and missionaries to the Philippine Islands. husband My and I pastored for 25 years. We have three biological children, two ad-

opted children, eleven grandchildren and two great-grandchild.

God placed a passion for young women and children into my heart as a young woman. In 2003 I became the founder and director of Teen Challenge House of Promise on the western slope of Colorado, a residential program for broken women and their children. In February of 2015 I was appointed the executive director of Sarah's Home, a residential program for rescued sex trafficked teen girls.

The desire of my heart is to love the Lord, my God, with all of my heart, soul and mind and my neighbor as myself.

Vicki Profitt is the Executive Director for both SARAH'S HOME and DANIEL ACADEMY. In 2018.

Vicki Profitt began hearing about the staggering numbers surrounding how many boys are being trafficked in the United States. It was at this time that God began laying it on her heart to open a home for boys. In 2020, she was approached by owners of an 1,800-acre ranch where the owners had unsuccessfully tried to open a home for boys coming out of sex trafficking. They had heard about Sarah's Home and reached out to see if



she could help them. They joined forces and developed Daniel Academy which was inspired by Daniel in the Bible.

They are a Christ-centered residential program for sex trafficked adolescent girls and boys with Aspire Academy as the accredited school. She works with the staff and volunteers in the program asking for prayers for young people to listen to the voice of God on their behalf; and for every part of their being to be healed and restored to the person God created them to be. Profitt will share the stories and tell us how we can assist in this ministry.

Pastor Stephani Shumaker



Stephanie is the Associate Pastor at Atonement Lutheran Church in Boulder, CO. She was installed on May 17, 2022. She is a graduate of the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. Before Atonement, Pastor Stephani worked

as a pediatric chaplain resident at the Children's Hospital of San Antonio, TX. Stephani is a native of San Antonio and has a BS in Public Health from Schreiner University. In 2019 Stephani was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant into the United States Air Force as a Chaplain Candidate. In her ministry, she is passionate about fostering meaningful experiences for people of all generations in worship, service, action, and community.

Pastor Stephani is mom to a 2-year-old dog Pico De Gallo and enjoys spending time outside, exercising, riding horses, baking, and knitting.

Susan Bolduc

Susan is a member of the First Lutheran Church and has volunteered in faith-based advocacy for more than 25 years. She believes our call to love our neighbor requires both charity and civic engagement.



Susan has served as a member and pres-

ident of our Rocky Mountain Synod's Advocacy Policy Committee and has led congregational and community social justice groups. She facilitates adult studies on ELCA Social Statements.

Currently, she is a member of The Colorado Springs Faith Table, advocating for affordable housing. She has testified at the State Capitol, The Colorado Springs City Council, Town Halls, and the Planning Commission. She is a member of Together Colorado, a statewide multi-faith, multi-racial Faith in Action organization. This group works on human dignity issues, such as housing, economic and racial justice, environment, immigration, health care, and transforming the justice system.

Previously, she worked on global and domestic hunger through Bread for the World. Susan worked on a subcommittee of The Millennium Development Goals, where she lobbied for the Jubilee Act to forgive the oppressive debt of the world's poorest countries.

In her working years, she was a stockbroker for Morgan Stanley, a financial advisor, a human resource manager for large corporations, and a cost engineer for power plant projects.

She is most proud of being a mother and grandmother. She has ten grandchildren, including a set of quintuplets.



Bishop Jim Gonia




Divinity degree from Luther Northwestern Seminary (now Luther Seminary) in 1988; and a Master of Theology degree in Islamic studies at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minn., in 1997.

His wife, Kim, is an ordained pastor in the ELCA serving Risen Lord Lutheran Church in Conifer, Colorado. They have three children, all graduates of Lutheran universities: Caroline, Mallory, and Peter.

Bishop Jim Gonia was elected to a six-year term on April 28, 2012, at the Rocky Mountain Synod's annual assembly in Colorado Springs, Colo. He was installed on September 23, 2012.

He served as a missionary in Madagascar from 1988 to 1998. From 1998 to 2009 he was called as the associate pastor of Atonement Lutheran Church in Denver. Prior to his election as bishop, he served the ELCA's churchwide ministries as Global Mission Area Program Director for West Africa, Tanzania and Madagascar. In this position Bishop Gonia was responsible for overseeing the ELCA's programs and relationships with Lutheran church bodies and partners in nine African countries.

Bishop Gonia received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Ind., in 1982; a Master of

We encourage every woman in the Rocky Mountain Synod to sign up to receive the weekly Synod Newsletter called e-Connection. It is sent out every Wednesday to your e-mail address, and it contains articles and pictures about many things in our lives together as Lutherans living in the states that make up the Rocky Mountain Synod.

Once a quarter, e-Connection will have an article about the current issue of our *Views from the Rockies*—the newsletter of the RMS Women's Organization. You will be directed to the Synod website, which is where *Views* issues will be available. You may read them online, and also print a copy for your personal use. Ask your church office to print the *Views* for you if you do not have access to the website.

Please sign up as follows:

1. On your computer, go to the Rocky Mountain Synod website by putting this URL into your

browser: https://www.rmselca.org/faithformation/RockyMountainSynodicalWomensOrganization

- 2. On the home page, scroll down to the bottom, and in the middle of the page you will see: Subscribe to e-mail Newsletter. Below that line is a yellow rectangle that says e-mail List. Simply click on the yellow rectangle! This takes you to a page that asks for your e-mail Address, your first & last name, and to check a box stating if you are a Pastor, Associate in Ministry, Diaconal Minister, or Deaconess. Below this you should check the box that states: "I wish to receive e-Connection each week."
- 3. Finally, click on the bottom bar that says "Sign Up." That's it! Remember, this is a free subscription to the synod e-mail weekly newsletter. You will receive notice of new issues of our *Views from the Rockies* newsletters from the synod's e-Connection e-mail.
