Job Description - Youth Director Trinity Lutheran Church – Boulder, CO

Job Summary

The Youth Director engages children, youth, and families of Trinity Lutheran Church through compassionate, creative, and courageous means to help youth wrestle with identity, belonging, and purpose through a grounding in Christian faith and community. While this position is responsible for overseeing all children's and youth activities, an emphasis will be on youth in 5-8th grade with an eye toward growing relationships and programming into the high school years.

This is a part-time salaried position with weekend and evening responsibilities, averaging 25 hours per week. On weeks when worked hours necessarily exceed 25 hours (such as during Day Camp, Confirmation Camp, or other outside youth events), compensation time off will be granted to bring the total monthly hours down to no more than 100 hours. Yearly compensation is set at \$30,000.

Essential Functions:

- Plans and implements children and youth programs and ministries in collaboration with the First Third of Life committee including Sunday school, elementary-aged Day Camp, and other events as planned.
- Recruits, equips, and supervises adult leaders, helpers, and parents to assist in Youth Ministry, with the help and support of the First Third of Life Committee
- Visions and takes risks while working collaboratively with the First Third of Life team to experiment with new youth ministry models in our evolving world.
- Schedules and equips Sunday School teachers; procures appropriate Sunday School curriculum
- Works collaboratively with the Senior Pastor to plan and oversee and/or teach the Confirmation program
- Attends confirmation camp, and/or synod and church-wide youth gatherings
- Looks for opportunities to create cross-generational situations both inside and outside of worship to foster and encourage sustainable, trusted, authentic relationships through meaningful conversation, shared rituals, and traditions

- Nurtures trusting and open relationships with youth and parents by listening empathetically and non-judgmentally while maintaining confidentiality appropriate boundaries.
- Manages the youth budget and finances with fiscal responsibly
- Encourages youth worship participation and helps equip them for worship leadership and spiritual growth
- Communicates effectively with youth, parents, and the congregation through print, verbal, text, and online means. Maintains open communication with staff to keep them apprised of youth activities.
- Attends and actively participates in the First Third of Life Committee monthly

Other Responsibilities:

- Participate in bi-weekly staff meetings
- Attends Sunday morning worship services and Sunday School
- General support of the ministries and mission of the congregation
- Networks with area congregations and youth workers
- Enrollment in CPR training within the first year required.

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree preferred. Coursework in Christian Religious Studies and/or extensive Bible study is helpful and preferred. Certificate in Youth Ministry highly desired.
- A member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or able to teach and support Lutheran theology with integrity.
- Demonstrated competency working with children and youth, ministry setting preferred.
- Willing and able to serve as a Christian role model.

About Trinity:

Trinity Lutheran Church is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) Trinity is an energetic, active church which serves Boulder and surrounding communities by living into our mission statement: A Mission Outpost in a Troubled World; Making a God-Shaped Impact on the World. A unique aspect of our Youth Ministry is our lack of need for multiple fundraisers, as parking cars for the University of Colorado football games raises enough to cover most all fundraising needs. A significant portion of this money is then given away to local community organizations through the youth-led Trinity Youth Community Fund.

- Attention to Detail: Consistently attends to the many small pieces which must be assembled into an organized whole; follows up on missing or out of balance items; resolves unanswered questions needed to address a problem; keeps the larger picture in mind while tending to the smallest of details.
- **Personal Resilience:** Can effectively cope with change and uncertainty; can shift gears comfortably; can decide and act without having the total picture; isn't upset when things are up in the air; can comfortably handle risk and uncertainty; is flexible.
- **Mission Ownership:** Demonstrates understanding and full support of the mission, vision, values and beliefs of the congregation; can demonstrate those values to others; consistently behaves in a manner congruent with the mission, vision, values and beliefs.
